This three-session workshop will walk participants through every step to establish a drought tolerant garden that includes native flowering plants. Creating a mini-pollinator garden at the library will give participants an outdoor and hands-on experience and a chance to see a garden plan unfold.

First session is August 12 from 5:30-7:00 pm

Participants choose a site at home and create a plan addressing these components: *A) Sun B) Soil C) Water D) Challenges*Pollinator Garden site design is 80-100 sq ft in any shape. Repeat design as needed. Learn how to use a "Pollinator Kit" for appropriate conditions.
