We welcome Kate Davis to our happy crew.

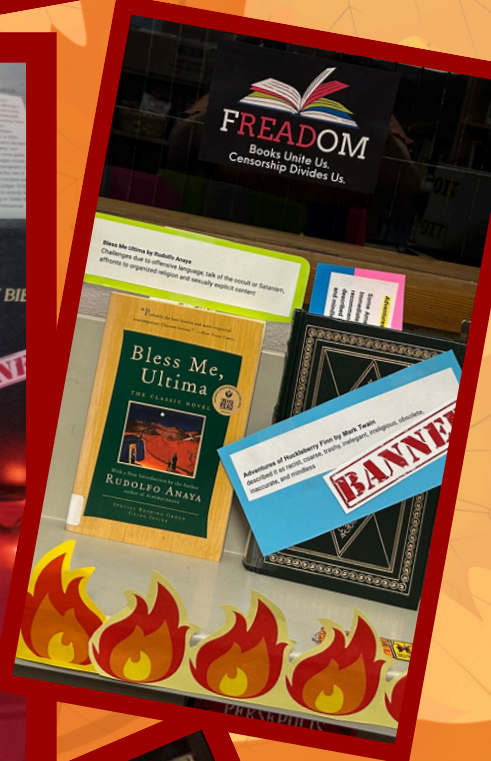
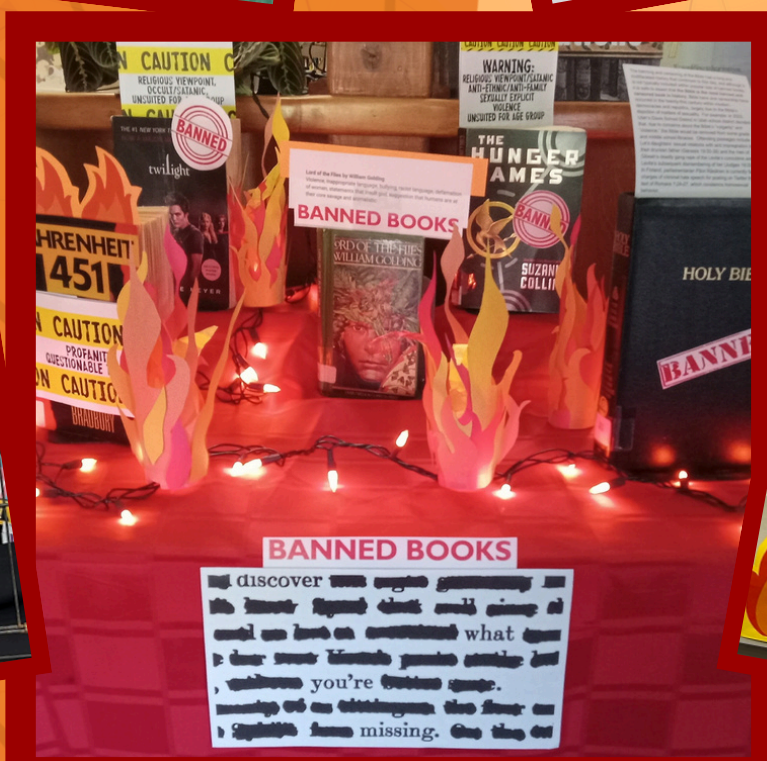
The winter storms have made this a perfect time to stock up on books, come on down and check out our cozy display and meet our new library gal while you're here.

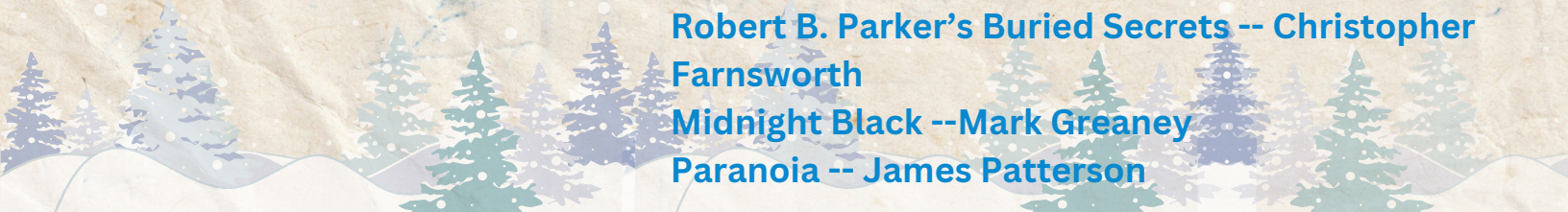

You can access over 70,000 free books at Project Gutenberg.

It was founded in 1971 and is the oldest digital library. Most of the items in its collection are the full texts of books or individual stories in the public domain. All files can be accessed for free on almost any computer.

The Talking Book and Braille Library at the State Library of Oregon is a FREE Braille and audio book library for any Oregonian with a print-disability, which means a person cannot read standard-size 12pt print for long periods of time comfortably. This free service is available through the mail or by download.

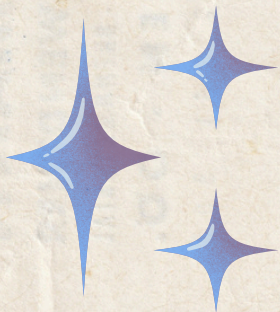

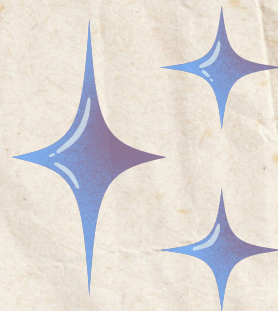
